Our History:

"A gift to Market Street," the newspapers wrote on January 17, 1941, when the Campus Theatre opened its doors for the first time. The Stiefels, four Russian émigré brothers, contracted renowned architect, David Supowitz, to design an Art Deco theatre. Supowitz provided the best in luxury and modernity, including a fire proof projection room, air-conditioning, curved walnut wood, art deco glass fixtures, twelve-foot high murals and - the first of its kind - an all-neon marquee. The theatre remained in the Stiefel family until 2001, surviving wars, recessions, the rise of TV and video, and the difficult economics of single-screen movie houses. The theatre is now run by a non-profit group, The Campus Theatre, LTD., which is dedicated to preserving Lewisburg's historic treasure while continuing to show great films.
