SYNOPSES OF UPCOMING FILMS

ANIMAL CRACKERS (1930 – G) 1 hr. 37 min. Comedy. Mayhem and zaniness ensue when a valuable painting goes missing during a party in honor of famed African explorer Captain Spaulding.

ANORA (2024 – R) 2 hrs. 19 min. Romantic Comedy. A young escort from Brooklyn meets and impulsively marries the son of a Russian oligarch. Once the news reaches Russia, her fairy tale is threatened as his parents set out for New York to get the marriage annulled.

BECOMING LED ZEPPELIN (2025 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 2 min. Music Documentary. The film traces the journeys of the four members of the Stairway to Heaven rockers through the music scene of the 1960s and their meeting in the summer of 1968, culminating in 1970.

EASTER PARADE (1948 – NR) 1 hr. 43 min. Musical. A nightclub performer hires a naive chorus girl to become his new dance partner to make his former partner jealous and to prove he can make any partner a star.

ERASERHEAD (1977 – NR) 1 hr. 29 min. Horror. Henry Spencer tries to survive his industrial environment, his angry girlfriend, and the unbearable screams of his newborn mutant child.

I'M STILL HERE (2024 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 17 min. Drama. A mother is forced to reinvent herself when her family's life is shattered by an act of arbitrary violence during the tightening grip of a military dictatorship in Brazil, 1971.

INSIDE OUT (2015 – PG) 1 hr. 35 min. Animation. After young Riley is uprooted from her Midwest life and moved to San Francisco, her emotions - Joy, Fear, Anger, Disgust and Sadness - conflict on how best to navigate a new city, house, and school.

LAST BREATH (2025 – PG-13) 1 hr. 33 min. Sea Adventure. A true story that follows seasoned deep-sea divers as they battle the raging elements to rescue their crew mate trapped hundreds of feet below the ocean's surface.

MARCELLA (2024 – NR) 1 hr. 37 min. Documentary. Marcella Hazan revolutionized home cooking, bringing real Italian flavors to millions. Meet the fiery chef behind the iconic cookbooks.

ONE TO ONE: JOHN & YOKO (2024 – R) 1 hr. 40 min. Music Documentary. Set in 1972 New York, this documentary explores John and Yoko's world amid a turbulent era. Centered on the One to One charity concert for special needs children, it features unseen archives, home movies, and restored footage.

PADDINGTON IN PERU (2024 – PG) 1 hr. 47 min. Family. Paddington returns to Peru to visit his beloved Aunt Lucy, who now resides at the Home for Retired Bears. With the Brown family in tow, a thrilling adventure ensues when a mystery plunges them into an unexpected journey.

THE ROOM NEXT DOOR (2024 – PG-13) 1 hr. 47 min. Drama. Ingrid and Martha were close friends in their youth, when they worked together at the same magazine. After years of being out of touch, they meet again in an extreme but strangely sweet situation.

TWIN PEAKS: FIRE WALK WITH ME (1992 – R) 2 hrs. 14 min. Psychological Horror. Laura Palmer's harrowing final days are chronicled one year after the murder of Teresa Banks, a resident of Twin Peaks' neighboring town.
