

U.S. theatres generally delay the broadcasts until the evening, or show the production on different days. These are the original live satellite feeds; no editing takes place between the time of transmission and showing. Movie passes are NOT accepted for these presentations. Doors open at 12:30. SYNOPSES OF UPCOMING FILMS

ATTACK OF THE 50 FOOT WOMAN (1993 – R) 1 hr. 30 min. Comedy/Sci-Fi. When an abused heiress grows to giant size because of her encounter with aliens, she decides to get revenge on her cheating husband and those who annoyed her.

BECOMING LED ZEPPELIN (2025 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 2 min. Music Documentary. The film traces the journeys of the four members of the Stairway To Heaven rockers through the music scene of the 1960s and their meeting in the summer of 1968, culminating in 1970.

THE BRUTALIST (2024 – R) 3 hrs. 34 min. Drama. When a visionary architect and his wife flee post-war Europe in 1947 to rebuild their legacy and witness the birth of modern United States, their lives are changed forever by a mysterious, wealthy client. *Showing with intermission!*

BUTCH CASSIDY & THE SUNDANCE KID (1969 – PG) 1 hr. 50 min. Western. In1890s Wyoming, Butch Cassidy and The Sundance Kid lead a band of outlaws. When a train robbery goes wrong, they find themselves on the run with a posse hard on their heels.

THE DAY THE EARTH STOOD STILL (1951 - G) 1 hr. 32 min. Sci-Fi. An alien lands in Washington, D.C. and tells the people of Earth that they must live peacefully or be destroyed as a danger to other planets.

THE DEVIL WEARS PRADA (2006 – PG-13) 1 hr. 49 min. Comedy/Drama. With an aspiration to become a journalist, Andy, a smart but sensible young graduate, travels to New York. She starts working as an assistant to one of the city's biggest high fashion magazine editors, the cynical Miranda Priestly.

DR. STANGELOVE (2025 – NR) 2 hrs. 30 min. Comedy. National Theatre Live Performance Screening. An explosively funny satire, about a rogue U.S General who triggers a nuclear attack.

DOGMAN (2025 – PG) 1 hr. 29 min. Animation. Dog Man, half dog and half man, he is sworn to protect and serve as he doggedly pursues the feline supervillain Petey the Cat.

EMILIA PEREZ (2024 – R) 2 hrs. 12 min. Comedy/Drama. Emilia Pérez follows three remarkable women in Mexico, each pursuing their own happiness. Cartel leader Emilia enlists unappreciated lawyer Rita to help fake her death so that she can finally live authentically as her true self.

FINDING THE MONEY (2023 – NR) 1 hr. 35 min. Documentary. An underdog group of economists is on a mission to instigate a paradigm shift by flipping our understanding of the national debt, and the nature of money, upside down.

GONE WITH THE WIND (1939 – G) 3 hrs. 58 min. Romantic Drama. A sheltered and manipulative Southern belle and a roguish profiteer face off in a turbulent romance as the society around them crumbles with the end of slavery and is rebuilt during the Civil War and Reconstruction periods. *Showing with intermission!*

I'M STILL HERE (2024 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 17 min. Drama. A mother is forced to reinvent herself when her family's life is shattered by an act of arbitrary violence during the tightening grip of a military dictatorship in Brazil, 1971.

THE LAST SHOWGIRL (2024 – R) 1 hr. 28 min. Drama. A seasoned showgirl must plan for her future when her show abruptly closes after a 30-year run.

NICKEL BOYS (2024 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 20 min. Drama. Based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel by Colson Whitehead, "Nickel Boys" chronicles the powerful friendship between two young African-American men navigating the harrowing trials of reform school together in Florida.

OSCAR SHORTS 2025: ANIMATION 1 hr. 21 min. 5 nominees: Yuck, Magic Candies, In the Shadow of the Cypress, Wander to Wonder.

OSCAR SHORTS 2025: LIVE ACTION 2 hrs. 13 min. 5 nominees: The Last Ranger, A Lien, I'm Not a Robot, The Man who could not remain Silent, Anuja.

OSCAR SHORTS 2025: DOCUMENTARY 2 hrs. 38 min. 5 nominees: Death by Numbers, I Am Ready, Warden, Incident, Instruments of a Beating Heart, and The Only Girl in the Orchestra.

RBG (2018 – PG) 1 hr. 38 min. Documentary. The exceptional life and career of U.S. Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, who has developed a breathtaking legal legacy while becoming an unexpected pop culture icon.

THE STING (1973 – PG) 2 hrs. 9 min. Crime/Drama. Two grifters team up to pull off the ultimate con.

THE SUBSTANCE (2024 – R) 2 hrs. 21 min. Horror/Drama. A fading celebrity takes a black-market drug: a cell-replicating substance that temporarily creates a younger, better version of herself.

WHO'S AFRAID OF VIRGINIA WOOLF? (1966 – NR) 2 hrs. 11 min. Drama. A middle-aged New England associate professor and his wife, with the help of alcohol, use their young guests to fuel anguish and emotional pain towards each other over the course of a distressing night.

WOMAN OF THE YEAR (1942 – NR) 1hr. 54 min. Comedy. Sportswriter Sam Craig and columnist Tess Harding, with the same New York newspaper, overcome their initial antagonism, fall in love and get married, only to find their relationship strained when he comes to resent her hectic lifestyle.

THE WOMEN (1939 – NR) 2 hrs. 13 min. Comedy. A study of the lives and romantic entanglements of various interconnected women.
